AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE

CAP Regulation 66-1, dated 14 SEPTEMBER 2015, is supplemented as follows:

4.1 Added: Aircraft assigned to Michigan Wing will be reassigned using ORMS to subordinate units selected by the DO and approved by the Wing Commander, that agree to host MIWG aircraft.

4.2 Added: Wing Director of Maintenance

Subject to Wing Commander approval, the DO shall appoint a Wing Director of Maintenance (DOM) whose responsibilities include ensuring that all MIWG aircraft are in compliance with FAR Part 43, including appendix A, B, D, E and F, CAPR 66-1 and this supplement. The DOM's responsibility shall include:

1. Contracting and scheduling the aircraft maintenance service with the designated maintenance facility based on requests from the hosting units.
2. Ensuring that all aircraft logbooks are properly maintained.
3. Monitoring the WMIRS Maintenance module to ensure that entries are complete and accurate upon completion of the maintenance action and that maintenance is being accomplished on schedule.
4. Timely reporting of maintenance expenditures paid using the assigned MIWG Maintenance credit card.
5. The MIWG Flight Operations Officer (DOO) will act in the capacity of the DOM when the DOM is unavailable or cannot be reached.

4.3 Added – Aircraft Manager (ACM) and Assistant Aircraft Manager (AACM).

Subject to approval by the DOO and DOM, each hosting unit Commander will appoint an Aircraft Manager (ACM) and Assistant Aircraft Manager (AACM) whose responsibilities will include the care and maintenance of the assigned aircraft. The ACM will assist the Wing DOM in determining the maintenance activities that must be performed and the schedule required. The ACM and AACM shall follow all maintenance and reporting procedures as outlined in the MIWG Aircraft Management Manual.

4.4 Added. – Aircrew

Aircrew operating MIWG aircraft are responsible for taking care of aircraft in their possession and returning it in a clean condition with all equipment properly stowed and all covers, locks and all Remove-before-flight flags installed as required. This includes pitot tube covers, tail tie down ring flags and cowl plugs and avionics locks if part of the individual aircraft's assigned equipment. The ACM must be notified of any missing or inoperative equipment by the PIC or other aircrew as soon as practical.

CAP pilots are responsible for proper preflight and post-flight inspection of the aircraft. Any discrepancy found must be relayed to the Wing AMO as soon as possible. If the discrepancy requires, the pilot may ground the aircraft by prominently placing the red "Grounded" placard from the AIF binder on the yoke, instrument panel or pilot's seat. The pilot shall enter the discrepancy in WMIRS after consultation with the AMO and shall notify the ACM of the reason for grounding.

9.5a Added: MIWG Survival Kits.

Survival kit contents are standardized for all aircraft. In addition, all MIWG aircraft will carry a list of the survival kit contents under tab 13 of the AIF. This list will include the expiration dates of all items that expire. **Kits will be reviewed monthly and expired items will be replaced.** Survival Kits will include the items found in attachment 1.
